Counselors work directly with faculty and administrators to provide accurate information to students as they make decisions about academic plans and maintain current information on transfer opportunities.

Placement Procedures

English (writing & reading) and math placement are determined by scores achieved when taking the Virginia Placement Test (VPT) that are administered by the college. The purpose of these tests is to assure that students are academically prepared for college-level work regardless of prior grades, work experience, or academic history. Students who do not meet

Dean's List

Students enrolled full-time who earn a semester grade point average of 3.2 or better for the semester are placed on the Dean's List.

President's Honor Roll

Students who have earned a minimum of 20 hours of credit at WCC, are carrying a minimum of 6 semester hours in a given semester, and have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or higher are included in the President's Honor Roll for that semester.

WCC Career Center

The [Career Center](#) which is housed in the [Academic Resource Center](#) offers assistance in career planning and job referral to students, alumni, and residents of the service area. The [Career Center](#) receives and distributes job announcements and listings from private industries and businesses, as well as from state, federal, and local agencies. In addition, the Career Counselor works with faculty and staff to establish contacts with potential employers and to arrange job referrals for students.

The Career Counselor assists students in making academic choices that affect future employment through individual testing and counseling, as well as through group sessions that are offered periodically. The [Career Center](#) also offers a job & resume posting system, mock interviews, career assessments, and career fairs. Students are advised to maintain contact with the Career Counselor throughout their enrollment at WCC.

TRIO Programs
